1. Hot Weather Guidelines

Basketball SA has adopted the following guidelines regarding the playing of basketball in hot weather conditions.

Irrespective of the predicted maximum temperature, stadium managers, coaches, team managers and referees should adopt the following (as appropriate), in cases of hot weather:

Stadium Managers should:

- Take steps to maximise airflow and reduce heat build-up in stadiums
- Assess playing conditions and advise referees and coaches
- Cancel or postpone games if playing conditions are considered unsafe

Coaches should:

- · Ascertain whether any players have known medical conditions which may be affected by heat
- Ensure that players take adequate fluid before, during and after the game
- Be alert and react to any signs of distress/potential distress in players
- Make substitutions as appropriate
- Utilise available time-outs

Team Managers should:

- Ascertain whether any players have known medical conditions which may be affected by heat
- Ensure that players take adequate fluid before, during and after the game
- Be alert and react to any signs of distress/potential distress in players

Referees should:

- Call additional time-outs
- Extend the breaks between quarters

No-one should ever feel as though they must play if they believe it is unsafe or they are feeling distressed.

2. Abbreviations and Definitions

Bureau of Meteorology (www.bom.gov.au): the BoM

Airconditioned Stadiums: For the purpose of this policy, airconditioned stadiums will include Titanium Security Arena, Starplex and The ARC

Ventilated Stadiums: For the purpose of this policy, ventilated stadiums will refer to Mount Barker (St Francis) and St Clair.

3. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to alert administrators, players, coaches, officials and parents/care givers when a game may be cancelled due to extreme heat.

4. District Basketball Competition – Hot Weather Policy

The District Basketball Competition Hot Weather Policy solely relates to district competitions managed by Basketball SA.

Basketball SA reserves the right to cancel games due to situations of extreme heat or catastrophic fire rating (where games held in affected locations).

Some games may not be cancelled if being held in air-conditioned or appropriately ventilated stadiums however consideration will be given to competition structure and opportunity for make-up games before deciding whether any games will proceed.

Basketball SA will use the following information to determine if conditions are considered extreme heat:

- Temperature readings within stadiums
- Predicted daytime temperature as published on the BoM website for Adelaide is 38 degrees or higher
- Predicted game time temperature as published on the BoM website for Adelaide
- Actual temperature over preceding days (ie. For potential heat build-up in stadiums)

Decisions are at the sole discretion of Basketball SA. Cancellations will be posted on the Basketball SA website and Facebook page by 12noon on game day, or 5pm Friday night for Saturday morning games.

When the predicted maximum temperature as published by the BoM for Adelaide is 35 degrees or higher, timing rules for all games will be modified as follows:

- 1. Referees to call a time-out at the half way point of each period, if one has not already been called
- 2. The quarter, half and three quarter time breaks to be extended by a minute
- 3. Referees and coaches may request additional timeouts (at the discretion of the referee) for the safety of players and officials.

5. Social Competition – Hot Weather Policy

The Social Competition Hot Weather Policy solely relates to Basketball SA managed social basketball competitions that are scheduled from 6:00pm to 10:30pm.

On days when the **actual** temperature for Adelaide (published on the BoM in the 3:00pm update for Adelaide, West Terrace) is **38 degrees or higher**, games shall be cancelled.

All games will be automatically cancelled if the **predicted forecast** for Adelaide on the BoM is **42 degrees or higher** (9:00am day of the game), this includes games played at air-conditioned stadiums.

It is the responsibility of Team Captains/Team Contacts and Team Members/Players to check the BoM website to see if games are to be cancelled. If there is any doubt, then it is highly recommended that the Team Captain/Contact and Players contact the local Stadium/Competition Manager and check to see if games have been cancelled. The responsibility to check game cancellations lies with the teams and players. Stadium Managers may post the decision to cancel games on the stadium Facebook page.

On days when the forecast maximum temperature by the BoM is **35 degrees or higher**, timing rules for games may be modified as follows:

- 1. Referees to call a time-out at the half way point of each period, if one has not already been called
- 2. The guarter, half and three guarter time breaks to be extended by a minute
- 3. Referees and coaches (at the discretion of the referee) may request additional timeouts for the safety of players and officials.

6. Miniball and Junior Domestic Competitions - Hot Weather Policy

The Miniball and Junior Domestic Competitions Hot Weather Policy solely relates to Miniball and Junior Domestic competitions managed by Basketball SA. The policy has been based on these competitions being played anywhere between 8:00am to 6:00pm.

On days when the predicted forecast maximum temperature for Adelaide (published at 8:00am day of the game) by the BoM is **35 degrees or higher**, all Miniball and Junior Domestic games will be cancelled or postponed, except those at air-conditioned stadiums.

On days when the predicted maximum temperature as published by the BoM is **30 degrees or higher**, timing rules for all games will be modified as follows:

- 1. Referees to call a time-out at the half way point of each period, if one has not already been called
- 2. The quarter, half and three quarter time breaks to be extended by a minute
- 3. Referees and coaches may request additional timeouts (at the discretion of the referee) for the safety of players and officials.

7. State Teams – Hot Weather Policy

On days when the forecast maximum temperature for Adelaide as published by the BoM is **38 degrees or higher**, all state team trials and/or games will be cancelled or postponed, unless scheduled at air-conditioned stadiums.

This can be overridden by Basketball SA management in consideration of the following conditions:

- Temperature readings within stadiums
- · Predicted game/training time temperature as published on the BoM website for Adelaide
- Actual temperature over preceding days (ie. For potential heat build-up in stadiums)

All State Team Coaches and Managers are to ensure that they provide a safe training environment for the players and any officials (for trial games) by adhering to the Hot Weather Guidelines (above).

Information regarding cancellations will be posted by the High Performance Manager on Basketball SA's website and Facebook page.
