SUPERVISING CHILDREN AT BASKETBALL CARNIVALS

Eastern Mavericks takes the duty of care of children very seriously.

Every effort will be taken to ensure the safety and security of children representing Eastern Mavericks District Basketball Club at Basketball Carnivals. While it is anticipated that nothing will occur that may cause concern, the Club must ensure it minimises any risk.

Adults supervising children while attending Basketball Carnivals are 'in loco parentis'. While a number of parents will also be in attendance the committee believes a minimum suite of standards are expected.

In outlining the suite of standards outlined below it the Club's expectation parents will cooperate with Coaches and Team Managers to ensure the children are at all times supervised:

- a) All Coaches and Team Managers must have completed all requirements as per Basketball SA Policy regarding Coaches Registrations and Team Managers appointments. DSCI is required for both positions.
- b) Parents are encouraged to also complete the Play by the Rules online program.
- c) It is preferred that an adult accompanying the team to have current Mandatory Notification Training
- d) It is preferred that an adult accompanying the team to have Senior First Aid Certificate
- e) While supervising children all adults must be alcohol/drug free
- f) Parents of children will sign a consent form giving the Coach and Team Manager authority to seek medical attention for any child who in the view of the Coach or Team Manager requires such attention.

It is the view of the Club that each child should have Hospital and Medical Extras coverage.

The Club however accepts that is a decision for families, however families will be liable for any medical cost incurred [eg: cost of Ambulance]

Parents not in attendance to the Carnival will be notified on a regular basis in the event their child seeking medical attention.
